About Swadhar IDWC

Swadhar IDWC, Pune, was established in Pune in 1995. It is affiliated to Swadhar Mumbai. Swadhar has been set up in order to help women in distress irrespective of their caste, religion or community. Swadhar also works for the education, health and the over-all development of under-privileged children, with special emphasis on the girl child from lower income groups.

Swadhar IDWC is a registered Non-Governmental Organization (NGO) and its membership is open to all, both men and women.

Swadhar means self-reliance and as the name suggests, it works to make every woman and child self-reliant., self-supporting and conscious of their rights so that they can live a decent, dignified life regardless of the strata of society to which they belong.

VISION

Swadhar IDWC seeks to help and empower women in distress and achieve a healthy development of underprivileged children, through education, guidance, training and counselling, to ensure a better quality of life for them.

MISSION

To provide services to women and children in order to ensure protection of their rights, promote self-reliance and empowerment for leading a dignified life.

GOALS & OBJECTIVES

1. To help /guide / counsel women in distress or need, through legal, economic and emotional support.
2. To create awareness among public, in general, and among women in particular, regarding women's identity, rights and changing roles.
3. To help children in need of survival, care, protection and development.
4. To provide gender specific services to the girl child through specialized knowledge, vocational counselling and awareness of their rights.

Creating Impact

Swadhar IDWC started its work by providing family counselling services to women in distress, which included directing them to family court, providing legal assistance and also providing financial support and protection whenever necessary. It also recognized the importance of addressing the needs of children at the same time.

Over the years the work of Swadhar has spread through various projects to reach beneficiaries across all age groups ranging from infants to adults. These projects address a wide range of needs, from support for survival and protection to building competitive ability for self-reliance and growth. Swadhar IDWC believes that needs and difficulties of women, children and families can best be addressed by providing developmental support through education, guidance and lifeskill training.

Activities for Women

1) Family Counselling

Family counselling has been the core activity of Swadhar IDWC since its inception. Women in need of help for difficulties related to marriage, divorce, relationships and self-reliance are assisted through the 3 Family Counselling Centres run by Swadhar IDWC.

The main aim of counselling is to help women talk about their problems in confidence; think of ways to deal with their problems or situations so that self-confidence can be restored and they can become physically and emotionally strong, independent and self-reliant in the true sense of the term.

The cases registered at the Family Counselling Centres are mostly of women from the low and lower-middle Socio Economic Strata (SES), who are victims of physical and mental harassment by their family members or society.

“The Protection for Women in Domestic Violence Law/Act,” (P. W. D. V. Act) has been enacted since 26th Oct. 2006. For the implementation of this act, Swadhar has been appointed by the judiciary as Service Providers. We receive cases from the Court for counselling and submit the reports.

So far we have received 8 cases from the Civil Court.

Four cases have been registered under this Act on behalf of Swadhar. The details of these cases are given below.

Swadhar's Family Counselling Centre is also a Centre recognized by the Family Court for supervision of access to children of separated/divorced parents. Since the last two years Family Court has been sending cases for access to Swadhar. Swadhar observed 3 cases from April 2008 to March 2009 as per the requirement of Family Court.

2) Awareness Generation Programme

Aims of this programme

- To make women aware of their duties and their rights
- To educate them on various subjects like nutrition, hygiene, budgeting, addiction, socio-legal aspects.
- To make them aware of their surroundings and to help them to become self reliant.

For conducting these programmes effectively, we have a collection of posters on various topics of Social Importance. These posters can be used according to the topics selected for the programmes, events, conferences, meetings etc.

This year we reached out to 700 women through lectures, street plays and poster exhibitions. We conducted 11 programmes alongwith CDPOs of Integrated Child Development Scheme (ICDS). In these programmes the following topics were covered

- Child marriage
- Nutrition and balanced diet
- Personal and social hygiene
- Cleanliness
- Family budget
- Addiction
- Superstition
- Legal rights of women

3) Girls' Education Support Programme

Girls' Education plays a major part in preparing a young girl towards empowerment. In India, girl's education often takes a back seat especially in case of economically disadvantaged families.

Swadhar Girls' Education Support Programme tackles this issue by providing girls with support for their education. The only criteria for selection of a girl for support is the economic condition of her family and her motivation to study.

Our support programme works at 3 different levels :

1. **School Education support** – A donor sponsors a school girl for one year by donating Rs. 2000/-

2. Vocational / Junior college and Higher Education support: Financial support as well as vocational guidance is provided.

3. NIOS (National Institute of Open Schooling): Open school secondary level certificate program – To motivate school dropouts to complete secondary education.

4) Phulora

(A programme for adolescent school drop-out girls)

Phulora is a programme designed for adolescent girls and young women in the age group of 14 to 24 yrs. Training programmes such as life skills, vocational skills, personality development provided by the centre have helped the beneficiaries to progress economically and towards self reliance. Lectures on various important and current topics have increased the general awareness of the girls. It has helped to widen their horizons. The girls have gained confidence and many of them have started earning. After completing ten months training, 8 girls have secured jobs.

This year, 5 girls worked with environmental group ECO COEXIST. The girls helped them to make some eco friendly products.

A group of girls from Phulora Bibvewadi is helping Akshardeep and Mohor in various tasks and tailoring.

This programme has encouraged the school drop out girls to appear for 10th standard examinations conducted by the National Institute of Open Schools.

The impact of this programme is reducing the rate of early marriages by making the girls aware of its hazards.

Activities for children

A) Activities for survival and protection

1) Mohor

(Day care centre, night school and night shelter for children of Sex Workers)

Mohor is a 10 year old project for the benefit of the children of sex workers. It started as a day care centre and has now expanded in the form of night school and night shelter thus taking care of children from infants to teenagers. This centre runs day and night. Many children are rehabilitated by admitting them in boarding schools.

Mohor is located in the very sensitive Budhwar Peth area (Pune's red light area). The project has created significant impact on the society, on the mothers of the beneficiaries and in the Government Departments.

These children are getting increasingly accepted by the society. Many people have started celebrating birthdays of their children and having picnics with the children of this centre. The local shopkeepers, doctors and pathological labs are recognizing our work and are generously offering their services.

The dependable local police assure the safety and protection of the children. The night school is run under Central Government's Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan. **This is the first collaborative effort of Municipal Corporation an NGO in Pune.** The Department of Education of PMC has been very supportive. They also provide financial help. Datta Mandir Trust has provided the Day Care Centre hall free of charge.

Vitrag Foundation is our main funding organization. They have supported our Day Care Centre for the last 3 years and now they have committed to support our night shelter activity for 3 years. This is very encouraging not only for Swadhar as an organization but also for the staff who work there.

2) Rays of Hope

(A project for HIV infected and affected children)

Since 2005 'Rays of Hope' has been helping children infected/affected by HIV/AIDS. The total number of cases registered under this project is 165. Out of these, 83 children are HIV+ and 82 are normal. The beneficiaries are supported for their grocery, nutrition, education and medicines. All children go to school. Very often the children and their family members need counselling which is provided by Swadhar's professional staff, to help them get through this very tough period of their lives.



Every month the children along with their parents and grand-parents visit the Swadhar IDWC centre for receiving grocery and nutrition packs. This has helped children to gain weight, improve their ability to fight opportunistic infections and increase the CD4 count (indicator of immunity level). Swadhar supports their education by paying school fees, conveyance to school and mid day meal. Currently 28 children are benefiting from this education support. The impact is seen in increased school attendance and reduced dropout rate.

Counselling is provided for hygienic habits, education, balanced diet, anti retro-viral (ART) adherence and safe sex practices. These sessions are need based and until now have helped 190 beneficiaries. As part of this health drive, Red Cross Society conducted a free medical check-up for all children. In addition, alternate medicines such as homeopathy were provided by Samvedan to further improve overall health. This support only meets the survival requirements of these children, and now we are trying to improve this to revitalize their lives.

In Diwali, a party was arranged for the children with snacks, ice creams, lunch and gifts. The older children were taken for a trip to Tulapur in February, which was immensely enjoyed by them.

B) Activities for education and overall development

1) Akshardeep

(Non Formal Education for Children below poverty line)

Swadhar IDWC is very proud of Akshardeep for bagging the award for excellence from the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA) for the year 2008-09, for running the alternative school classes successfully.

This non formal education (NFE) programme for out-of-school children living in extremely backward slums is being run since 1998.

These classes are located in Bibwewadi and Pimpri-Chinchwad areas of Pune city. The children and teachers live in the same community and the timings are sufficiently flexible so as to cater to the educational needs of the children. The curriculum is based on the prescribed format of the State Department of Education and is taught in an enjoyable and easy method. The aim of this programme is to ensure that under-privileged children are retained in these classes and ultimately mainstreamed in the formal school system.

Impact

The Educational Committee (supported by Asmae) consisting of experts in education and social work was formed in May 2008, to study the social, educational and organizational aspects of Project Akshardeep. This committee consists of the following members.

Following progress was observed :

Activities

Science Day, Diwali Mela, Sports day, Annual day, and visits to Bank and Post Office were organized to encourage the overall development of the children.

Nutrition programme in the form of a tasty Protein supplement was initiated in all classes resulting in an increase in attendance in the classes, and improvement in the health of the children. The work of packing and making of this supplement has been given to girls in Phulora Project.

Parent meets were conducted twice in the year emphasizing early childhood development.

The project aims to achieve the following -

- To try and mainstream as many children as possible.
- To improve the quality of the programme.

- To start a resource centre with the following aims:
 - i. To develop common Teaching Aids Bank so that they can be circulated amongst the classes,
 - ii. To provide a place where children can access joyful, child friendly educational material,
 - iii. To set up a library for children and teachers.

2) Reading class Programme

(for students of primary schools run by Pune and Pimpri Chinchwad Municipal Corporations)

After mainstreaming students from NFE classes into corporation schools it was realized that if reading skills of the children could be enhanced, it would help reducing the dropout rate. As a result, the Reading Class Project was started as an additional input to improve the overall reading ability of children. This project is presently being implemented in 58 Marathi and 5 Urdu medium Corporation Schools, in Pune and Pimpri Chinchwad areas.

The aims of the Project are:

- To develop reading skills in children in standard I to IV.
- To make story books and books other than text books available to the children in the lower income group.
- To help children develop their vocabulary.

Swadhar IDWC - Asmae Reading Class Project

The Pune Municipal Corporation has allotted time for conducting this programme. The book fairies appointed by Swadhar take books to the class and distribute them to the children according to her/his reading level. The Book Fairy makes each child read individually in every class. The class begins with a prayer to settle the children, and then group activities like word games, songs and story telling are conducted. A Reading Ability test is given twice during the academic year to see the improvement in the child's reading skills.

Swadhar IDWC - Forbes Marshall-School Library Project

This is the second year of this project in PCMC schools. Last year, we started with 25 Corporation schools in Pimpri Chinchwad for 1st to 4th standard in Marathi and Urdu medium. Now, the number of schools has increased to 48.

This year, we conducted 2 classes per week for 1st standard students. This was an experiment to get the children more interested in books and reading, as also to increase the reading levels from the very beginning.

In accordance with the PCMC Education policy, it was decided that students of 1st std. will not be taught alphabets in the 1st term under the scheme 'Ananddayi Shikshan'. This prompted introducing different kind of exercises for the students. Therefore, with guidance and help from Forbes Marshall and some consultation with Door Step School,

our staff prepared pictorial worksheets in 3 levels, These were printed and used regularly. They were appreciated by the students as well as by the school teachers. These worksheets are in the process of being compiled in the form of a workbook for future use.

This year the overall statistics are as below:

Impact

Above findings are consistently observed by Swadhar and supported in the ASMAE study.

As a result of the positive impact of this programme, the Shikshan Mandal has asked us to extend this programme to as many schools as possible.

Activities for the Community

1) Community Centres

Swadhar IDWC, Wipro Cares and Asha for Education-Chicago, came together to start Community Centres, namely Indradhanu and Asha, at Shivrai Nagar and Kakade Vasti in Bibvewadi. These Community Centres are a collaborative initiative of Swadhar with Wipro Cares and Asha.

The objective of the Community Centre is to bring all activities of Swadhar IDWC for women and children under one roof, accessible to the people in the community so that they can benefit from it.

Indradhanu (Community Centre)

Swadhar IDWC and Wipro Cares have completed one and a half years of its operation. Approximately 800 residents of the community have benefitted in this centre.

Asha (Community Centre)

This centre was started on 3rd November 2008 at Kakade Vasti mainly populated by migrants from the border area of Karnataka and Andhra Pradesh.

An awareness generation programme on HIV / AIDS was conducted in March. Immediately a demand for HIV detection was put forward by the community members. Another programme on laws for women was organised for female members of the community which elicited a very good response.

Urban facilities like school, local transport, playgrounds, toilets etc. are totally absent in these areas. The new projects have been well received by the people. The women are happy to have these centres in the area where they gather to talk to the social-worker, who is always available to guide them on any issues. The impact will surely grow in the near future.

2) Spoken English Course :

A new activity of Spoken English class was conducted between May 2008 and September 2008

At the request of the Management of Sahyadri Hospital, this course for Spoken English was conducted for their front office, grade II and grade III staff members. There were 2 batches each of 15-20 people. An additional batch of workers in the operation theatre was also trained. Ms. Smita Talwalkar looked after the planning, coordination, designing of the curriculum and conducted these classes with the help of a few other volunteers. This programme was appreciated by the Hospital authorities as well as the participants.

- Swadhar IDWC Pune has obtained the FCRA registration from the Govt of India to receive donations from abroad.
- Swadhar IDWC is very proud of the work done by the staff of Akshardeep project as the project has bagged the award for excellence from Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan for the year 2008-09 for successfully conducting alternative school classes.
- Swadhar IDWC has published a workbook "Mazi Suraksha", a book for protection of children from sexual abuse, a Marathi translation of the original book "My Personal Safety" published by Tulir, Chennai.
- Staff of RCP-PCMC project of Swadhar IDWC have developed a set of pictorial worksheets for students studying in 1st standard in Marathi medium schools. This work has been appreciated by students and teachers of PCMC schools. This set of worksheets will be published as a workbook.
- Swadhar IDWC , Akshardeep, NFE classes cater to the children of migrant labourers. A new 150 day syllabus has been developed for all subjects, for the use in these classes. This is a novel initiative of this project. Teachers' training based on the new syllabus has been conducted.
